Here's what we have been doing this month!

Language Arts

We have been working writing a narrative story focusing on including a beginning, middle and end to the story. This is new for the students, but they are working hard to include lots of details in their story.

We have finished Module A of our first reading unit and are part way through Module B. We have been learning about graphic features found in informational texts and how they help us to understand what is written in the text.

Science

We have finished up our first science unit on plants. We played a review game on Kahoot to help us prepare for our first test. We learned about botany and the parts of a plant. Ask your child if they can tell you who discovered over 200 uses for peanuts (the answer is George Washington Carver). We talked about the four things that most plants need in order to grow and we talked about the life cycle of a plant.

Math

We have been reviewing many concepts from first grade math: telling time to the hour, and doubles facts. We also began talking about some, some more (addition) story problems, and some, some went away (subtraction) story problems. We learned about even and odd numbers. We started practicing our math facts on the computer with the website called XtraMath. I sent home log in information for XtraMath so your child can practice at home. If you need that information again, please let me know.

History

We completed our Me on the Map projects and started talking about geography of the Americas. We learned about the continent of North America and the 3 countries that make up North America. We talked about some features on maps that help us to know how to use the map. We watch a couple music videos about the cardinal directions and the "50 Nifty United States". We are now learning about Central and South America.
