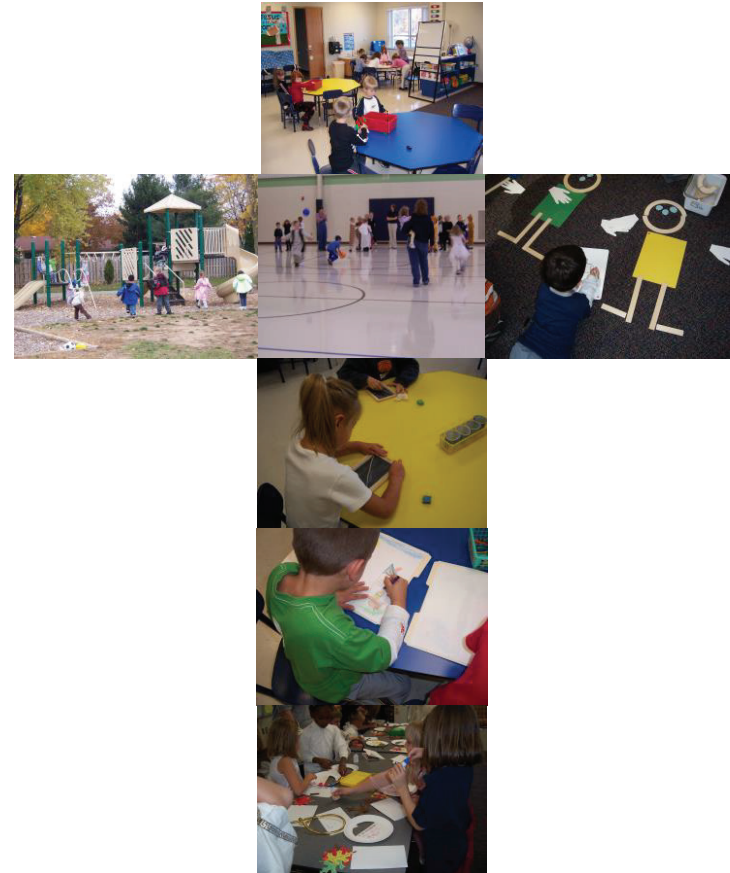

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Phonics and Language

Our kindergarten language program is a balanced curriculum. Using trade books, leveled texts and phonics cues to engage the whole learner. Reading aloud daily exposes children to different types of literature. Children also work in groups with the teacher to develop phonemic awareness and phonics skills.

Mathematics

Our kindergarten math program focuses on a variety of introductory math skills such as counting, writing and reading numbers, one-to-one correspondence, sorting objects, patterns, shapes, graphs, coins, comparing sizes of objects, and sequencing. We also introduce basic addition and subtraction, measurement, and time to the hour.

Science and Social Studies

Our science and social studies programs are introduced in integrated units throughout the year. The reading program includes many expository texts from which we learn about communities, growing, and different cultures. Science is also included in many Bible lessons.

Handwriting

We use the D'Nealian method, which incorporates “monkey tails.” This type of handwriting makes the transition to cursive writing easier. We feel that handwritten notes and passages are an important component of learning.

Religion

Throughout the day, our faith is incorporated into all subject areas as well as actions displayed by teachers and students. We expose students to a variety of Bible passages, which discuss practical application and Biblical truths. Songs and prayers are used to reinforce the Bible lessons.

Music

The students have music twice a week. They sing a variety of classic children's songs, hymns, and contemporary Christian music. They also learn about basic music theory. Once a year, the students are invited to sing during worship at St. Michael Lutheran Church as well as performing in the Christmas show and Spring Concert.

Art

Kindergarten Art focuses on developing the student's skills in drawing, painting, cutting and pasting, and working with clay and other materials.

Physical Education

The students have gym class weekly. During this time, they practice basic locomotive skills, learn the importance of personal space, and learn about healthy eating and exercise habits.

Socialization

Socialization is threaded throughout the day's activities. Students are continually exposed to activities that encourage cooperative play.
