5 day Pre-Kindergarten Program:

5 day Pre-Kindergarten is designed to give your child the extra gift of time. Students who need additional time with academics or socialization before entering full-day kindergarten can benefit from our 5 day Pre-Kindergarten program. This program will focus on socialization and kindergarten preparedness skills such as beginning phonics skills, math concepts, reading, and independence.

School Readiness

St. Michael Lutheran Preschool is taught by qualified teachers and assistants. Our preschool programs use thematic units to help children achieve skills that will prepare them for school including following directions, sitting and listening, cutting, tracing, sequencing and playing with others, as well as letters, shapes, colors, numbers etc. Students learn to recognize numbers, shapes and colors through music, poems and cooperative learning projects.

Religion

Throughout the day our faith is incorporated into all subject areas as well as actions displayed by teachers. We expose students to a variety of Bible stories which discuss practical application and Biblical truths. Songs and prayers are used to reinforce the Bible lessons.

Fine Motor Skills

Students build fine motor skills while beading, cutting, gluing, painting, coloring, buttoning, zipping and molding. Students in preschool classes will practice writing their names and numbers as well as all letters of the alphabet.

Language

Throughout the class teachers interact with students to help them expand their language skills. The daily structure is designed to encourage the use of language amongst peers.

Literacy

Literacy opportunities surround our early-childhood students. The library center is kept well stocked. Simple signs are on the walls and students quickly master name recognition as they find their name and practice writing their name every day. Students in the 3's and 4's program learn to recognize letters and sounds and in TK they begin blending simple words.

<u>Art</u>

We love to make messes (and learn how to clean them up)! The focus of art projects is on the *process* not the *product*.

Mathematics

Our students are exposed to a wide variety of math skills. This includes work in sorting and classifying as well as measuring. We also do addition and subtraction, as well as graphing. We count the days of the month and the number of friends in school each day.

Science

Science concepts are an important part of our center time. Our sensory tables are kept full of items to activate the mind of budding scientists and include activities such as sinking/floating, melt-

ing, digging in dirt, measuring, molding and much, much more! **Music**

Music is an important part of our learning environment. Singing may be used to reinforce Biblical themes, for celebrations or to master a specific concept. Background music might help us monitor our volume, and sometimes we use music just to be silly! Additionally, all of our early-childhood classes have the opportunity to attend music class where they are introduced to basic choral concepts such singing and rhythm. Our 4's and 5's program participates in music class once a week that is taught by our St. Michael Lutheran School music teacher.

Gross Motor

Young students love to move! We do some type of gross motor activity everyday. We may go outside or to the gym or just hang out in the room and move to music.

Socialization

Socialization is threaded throughout our day's activities. Students are continually exposed to activities that encourage cooperative play.
